We have built relationships with these organizations that deepen our relationships in the community. We have built this club into a leader in the arts and culture community. People know who we are and we are making a difference. I am going to list the things we did in 2017 to help the community and promote our club.

- 1) Sponsor for the Celebrity Dance Off Benefits for 2017 to the Children Advocacy and Sexual Assault Center
- 2) Family Dances Partnering with and helping to promote the Red Deer Culture Heritage Society, the Red Deer Arts Council and working with the City of Red Deer. We bring the love of dance to a whole new generation of people by exposing them to a positive, healthy, family friendly community event.
- 3) Participation in the Red Deer Parade to promote ourselves, our sponsors, and project a positive image to the community.
- 4) Sponsorship for the Canada 150 fireworks celebrations for Canada Day to help make it a big event for the entire City.
- 5) Alberta Culture Days Cross promoting other dance organizations in Red Deer during the weekend. The Celebration of Dance we spear headed has become an important part of the weekend events and is an official sub committee of the Red Deer Arts Council.
- 6) International Westcoast Swing Flashmob Promoting the City of Red Deer internationally around the world by being featured in a world wide promotional video featuring 246 cites around the world. Promoting with Red Deer tourism on their website and ours.
- 7) Brought in world class instructors from the USA to help us host a successful weekend workshop
- 8) Donating manpower and food to the Red Deer Culture and Heritage Society in a co-operative event at the Cronquist House to show community support.
- 9) Donations to the Red Deer Food bank and the Christmas Bureau
- 10) Performances at senior centers on a volunteer basis to spread good will.

Financial

Although our bingo revenue was down from 2016 due to economic times we operated approx \$4,000 under our 2017 budget of \$52,574 and continued to build on our cash reserves. Casino revenues we also down in 2017 from our last Casino in 2014 from \$28,000 to 22,500. However keeping spending to budget and strong income from donations, membership, and honorariums kept us in a positive cash-flow position. We do a lot in the community and for our membership, and yet maintain fiscal responsibility to keep the club self sustaining. Setting a budget of approx \$50,000 for 2018 will allow us to continue with our programs and plan more events for the future.

Membership and Dance Team

Membership is strong and consistent. We developed new membership levels to involve more people. Our dance team continues to grow with new people and we add more material to our public performances. The team continues to be an integral face for the club in the community and projects our purpose to the public. We have built relationships with other groups and are being asked to participate in high profile events such as the 2019 Canada Winter Games.

Attendance

Remains very strong and well attended. Classes such as 2-step and Westcoast Swing are to capacity at Festival Hall and we are open to the idea of expanding further.

The free Tuesday evening practice time we book at Festival Hall organized by Bob and Dorothy Gosselin continues to grow and is well attended. It is another benefit we offer as a club.
